Transportation to NCAR from hotels: We will try to organize rides from these four hotels listed above. Please let Cecilia know your hotel arrangements if in one of these four. If you stay at another hotel, we recommend you take a taxi or rent a car to get to NCAR Mesa Lab.

Refreshment Fee: Our funding does not permit us to cover food or beverages and we feel that coffee and pastries are essential to meeting breaks. Therefore, we ask that you pay a donation of \$40 (for both days) so we may supply these items at the start of each morning and at the coffee breaks. Cash or checks made out to Cecilia Bitz will be accepted at the workshop.

Flights: If your airfare is being covered by the workshop organizers, you must comply with the Fly America Act, which means you must fly on a US flag air carrier (examples are United, US Airways, Delta, and many other US domestic airlines). For international participants, you can book a flight through a US flag air carrier that code shares and hence you may actually fly on a foreign airlines. You must pay the US air carrier for the ticket. There are other exceptions but they require pages of documentation. If you have any doubts about whether you are complying with fly America, send us your flight plans in advance.

Denver airport to Boulder ground transportation options:


One option is the RTD SkyRide Bus from Denver International Airport (DIA) to Boulder. It costs \$13 EXACT CASH only, one way (keep the receipt for transfer later). See schedule on next page.

For Millennium or Quality Inn: Take the bus to the end of the line at the Boulder bus terminal, where you will be 1.2 miles from the hotel at which point you can transfer to the local bus on the route called "Jump" (don't be tempted by Hop or Skip). The Jump is frequent, but if you find it not frequent enough, you can walk in 25 min or take a cab. The map included shows the airport bus route coming into Boulder on Broadway, turning on Walnut and with "Jump" marking the Boulder bus terminal and B marking the hotel.


For Rodeway Inn or Boulder Inn: Get of the SkyRide bus at Baseline Road. This stop is shortly after the "Table Mesa Park and Ride" stop, but you must ring the bell to request it. You may want to ask the driver for help finding Baseline, while stopped at the Table Mesa Park and Ride. Walk 10-15 min to either hotel or transfer to the "Bound" bus. It comes quite about every 10-15 min. The Bound goes east on Baseline and then north on 30th, and neither hotel can be seen visually from the bus.

Another option is Supper Shuttle, which costs \$33 one way. You can book in advance at www.supershuttle.com or go to their booth on the ground floor of the airport. It will take you directly to your hotel, but it may stop nearly anywhere on the way to Boulder and can be slower or quicker than the bus, depending on your luck.

I generally attempt to take the bus and if I've just missed it, I take the shuttle. Arrive at the bus $\sim\!10$ min early if you can for loading. On your way home, if you need to leave from NCAR, the shuttle back to the airport is probably simplest and you should book it in advance. The bus is possible too, ask me (Cecilia) at the workshop how.
